

Jerry Moyes

Chief Executive Officer, Founder

Moyes, 67, is CEO and Founder of Phoenix-headquartered Swift Transportation Company, a publicly traded multi-billion dollar company that he started with a single truck. Founded in 1966, Swift Transportation is the nation's largest truckload carrier and provides Best-in-Class transportation services to its customers, many of whom are the nation's largest retailers. Swift Transportation's 16,000 award-winning professional truck drivers safely travel millions of miles each week delivering freight.

A native of Plain City, Utah, Moyes relocated to Phoenix in 1966 and began hauling steel with his one truck, forming a partnership with a steel importer called Common Market Dist. Corp., which he later merged with a company he founded, Swift Transportation. In 1986, he was named Chairman of the Board, Chief Executive Officer, and President of the company. Swift originally went public in 1990, private in 2007, and public once again in 2010. Swift Transportation has developed into one of the most successful truckload carriers in the United States, having grown its operating revenue from \$33 million in 1985 to nearly \$3.0 billion in 2010.

A graduate of Weber State College, Moyes has also been involved in a number of other organizations, previously serving as vice president of the American Trucking Association and as president of the Arizona Motor Transport Association. He served as a board member of the Truckload Carriers Association, a Director for the Greater Phoenix Economic Council, and a member of the Center for Entrepreneurship at Brigham Young University.

Mr. Moyes also has extensive business interests in other trucking companies, aviation, manufacturing, and real estate.

Jerry and his wife Vickie have been married for 44 years and have ten children, seventeen grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren. They are actively involved in the community with a special interest/focus on children, education, and women's issues. Some of the organizations the family is actively engaged include the West Valley Child Crisis Center, the Special Olympics, the Boys & Girls Clubs, and UMOM, as well as a private scholarship program.
